
Welcome back spring!

Paddling is Us!

Seeley's Bay is about to get known as a paddling hot spot thanks to a new project of the Rideau Heritage Route (RHR) destination marketing organization. The RHR is developing a new high tech website that will allow paddlers to choose sites they wish to visit in order to create their own customized route. For 2012 Seeley's Bay is going to be featured as a model paddling community on this web site.

In order to deliver on the promise of being a paddling-friendly community, a unique paddlers' station is being constructed on the shore of Centennial Park. The services will include a customized dock, directional signage, boat racks and stow bins so that visitors may safely protect their gear while they take a stroll into the village to shop and sightsee. This project will be officially launched on May 20th at the first annual Spring Opener celebration and the Seeley's Bay and Area Residents' Association, which is leading the project, is hoping for financial assistance from the Township's Grants Committee to help cover the costs involved.

Area Member of Parliament **Gord Brown** and other special guests have been invited to officially launch the new Seeley's Bay paddling services at **4:30 on Sunday, May 20**. Please "BYOP" **bring your own picnic** down to the site, join in the celebration, and get a **free chance at winning a high quality kayak**, a paddle and a lesson from an expert - Scott Ewart of 1000 Islands Kayaking. 
